EXPLANATION OF FOOTNOTES

Associate degree requirements at the community college, including the minimum allowed grade point average, are found in the community college catalog in effect during the student's initial semester of continuous enrollment. See a community college counselor for more information.

Please note that not all courses are offered at all community colleges. Check with your counselor for availability of courses on your campus.

- * UHCL's requirements are consistent with the 42-hour Texas core curriculum. If a student completes a component of the core at one Texas institution, that block of courses will be substituted for UHCL's same core component(s). Additional Program Foundation courses are required. **Please refer to your community college's core requirements for specific courses in each area below.**
- ** These Curriculum and Foundation Requirements may be fulfilled by approved upper-level equivalents at UHCL. **UHCL Students:** Check with your academic advisor before enrolling in upper-level courses to satisfy core curriculum.
- a Six hours of lower-level English composition required; grades must be "C-" or better.
- b Suggested courses for Humanities include: any ENGL literature, HUMA, PHIL, RELI, SPCH or HIST (in addition to core requirements), or sophomore-level foreign language course.
- c Six hours of American History required: three hours may be in Texas History.
- d Suggested courses for Visual and Performing Arts include: any ARTS, DANC, DRAM, MUSI, OR MUAP course. Three semester hours credit required.
- e Suggested courses for Natural Science include: any ASTR, BIOL, CHEM, ESCI, GEOL, or PHYS courses. **Environmental Management students MUST take two semesters of chemistry.**
- f Suggested courses for Social and Behavioral Science include: any ANTH, ECON, GEOG, PSYC, or SOCI course. Also any GOVT, HIST, or POLS course in addition to core requirements.
- g Suggested courses for Speech Communication include: Any SPCH course. (COMM 4233 at UHCL)
- h Suggested courses for Computer Competency include: any COSC, CSCI or ITSC course. Other courses may meet this requirement. Please check with an advisor on your campus.
- i Students in the **Environmental Management** program may replace six hours of Accounting Principles with Biology, Geology, Physics, Ecology, Environmental Science or Chemistry beyond the six hours required for admission to the program. **Legal Studies** students may replace Accounting Principles II with English beyond the core curriculum requirements or a foreign language.
- j **BUS** graduation requirements specifically include both College Algebra (or calculus) and Finite Math for Environmental Management majors. Legal Studies students may replace MATH 1324 with English beyond the core curriculum requirements or a foreign language.
- k With the exception of remedial courses, these courses will count toward the bachelor's degree at UHCL as lower-level electives. These courses are either prerequisite courses for required university courses, courses required for the associate degree, or are required remedial courses to satisfy the TASP mandate
- # The core component number is used by Texas schools to identify which area of the 42-hour core curriculum a course fulfills.

GENERAL DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

- A total of 120 semester hours of applicable college credit. A maximum of three hours of lower-level "activities" courses may be applied toward graduation. No more than 18 semester hours of lower-level credit may have been taken by correspondence, extension or CLEP. No more than three hours in History and/or Government may be earned through CLEP.
- At least 60 semester hours of upper-level work. Correspondence, extension or CLEP credit cannot be used to fulfill this requirement. A minimum of 30 hours of resident upper-level work must be completed with grades of "C" or better. Grades of "C-" and below are not acceptable.
- No more than 25% of the upper-level credit hours can come from the business fields of accounting, BAPA, decision sciences, economics, finance, healthcare administration, management information systems, management and marketing.
- The final 30 hours of upper-level course work must be taken in residence at UHCL. A minimum of 12 hours of courses in the major must be taken in residence at UHCL.
- A cumulative GPA of 2.000 on course work completed at UHCL. Grades of "C" or better must be earned on at least 30 hours of resident upper-level coursework.
- Remain continuously enrolled (complete at least one course in a 12 month period) or meet requirements of a later catalog.
- Complete the degree within seven years or meet requirements of a later catalog.

UPPER-LEVEL PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS FOR THE BACHELOR OF SCIENCE (BS) DEGREE

*ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT

27 hours of Environmental Management course work
18 hours of CHEM, DSCI, MGMT, and WRIT course work
15 hours of science, general and non-business electives

*LEGAL STUDIES

36 hours of Legal Studies course work
12 hours of approved elective course work
12 hours of general electives

*All degrees in the School of Business require a minimum of 60 upper-level hours and 120 total hours.
