NetLibrary

Alfred R. Neumann Library, University of Houston Clear Lake

NetLibrary is a collection of electronic books (eBooks) that can be viewed online from any computer connected to the Internet. There are three collections in **NetLibrary**. The *University of Houston, Clear Lake Collection* has eBooks that Neumann Library has purchased for your use. The *Publicly Accessible eBooks Collection* has public domain works that are free to everyone. The remaining eBooks may be searched, but are unavailable for viewing as they are copyrighted works that are not part of Neumann Library's subscription.

STARTING NETLIBRARY

From the library's World Wide Web homepage (<http://www.uhcl.edu/library>), click on **Databases A-Z**. Select the tab **Databases by Name**, click **N**, and then click on the **NetLibrary** hyperlink.

CREATING AN ACCOUNT

The first time you use **NetLibrary**, you must access it in the library, from the library's website to create an account for viewing eBooks from a remote location. Once you have created your account, you may log in to **NetLibrary** from the library's website or by going directly to <http://www.netlibrary.com>.

To create your account:

- Click the **Create a Free Account** link at the top right of the screen.

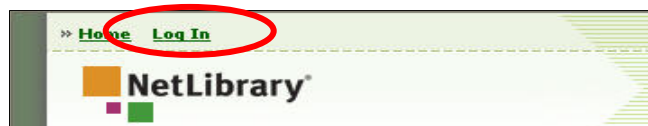

On the Create an Account page:

- Type the user name and password of your choice in the appropriate fields. *Make a note of your user name and password. You will need them to log in for future sessions.*
- Select a security question from the pull-down menu.
- In the *answer* field, type the appropriate response for your security question.
- Enter your first name, last name, and email address.
- Click the **Create Account** button.
- You are automatically logged in to **NetLibrary** for your first session.

LOGGING IN

For any session after your first, you must log in if you wish to view eBooks from off campus.



HOW TO SEARCH

- **Basic Search:** Type a word or phrase in the box. Select *Full-Text, Keyword, Title, Author* or *Subject* search type by using the pull-down menu next to the search box, and then click the **Search** button.
- **Advanced Search:** The recommended search form. See example on next page.

Advanced Search

Type search terms here.

Narrow your search with *and*, *near*, or *not*. Broaden your search with *or*.

Note: Choose optional limits for e.g. *Year Published*, *Language* etc. to further narrow your search.

Choose specific fields to search from the pull-down menus.

Click **Search** when ready.

Results may be sorted by *Rank*, *Title*, *Author*, *Newest First*, or *Oldest First*.

Click **Show Details** to view bibliographic information and excerpts from the eBook.
