


SocINDEX with Full Text

SocINDEX with Full Text provides comprehensive coverage of most social science disciplines, including sociology and such areas as criminology and criminal justice, topics in demography and geography, ethnic and racial studies, gender studies, history and social history, marriage and family, political science, religions, rural and urban sociology, social development, social psychology, social structure, social work, cultural anthropology, social theory, substance abuse and women's studies. Abstracts are provided for more than 750 core coverage journals, indexing for several thousand journals. It contains selective full text for 344 core journals, 129 priority journals, 700 books and dissertations, and 6,800 conference papers. Coverage begins as early as 1895 and varies by journal. This database has coverage in some ways similar to and complimentary to such UHCL databases as: *Sociological Abstracts*; *Social Work Abstracts*; *Social Sciences Full Text*; *America-History & Life*.

STARTING & SEARCHING SOCINDEX WITH FULL TEXT

From the library's World Wide Web homepage (<http://www.uhcl.edu/library>), click on **Databases A-Z**. In the alphabetical list of databases by name, click on the **SocINDEX with Full Text** hyperlink.

Advanced Search with Boolean/phrase search mode is the default search method. See sample search form below.



Enter search terms (truncate terms with an asterisk to find words with related spellings). Connect multiple terms with a Boolean operator (AND, OR, NOT).

Help menu includes searching, citation styles, translation, etc.

If desired, specify a field (Author, Title, Subject Terms, Publication Name, All Text, etc.) for some or all of your search terms.

Caution: Using the Full Text limiter will exclude full text articles available via Article Linker.

Other useful document type limiters include book review, bibliography, case study, conference paper, dissertation, essay, etc.

Narrow your results with limiters, such as restricting articles to peer-reviewed journals.

You may enter a beginning date, ending date, or a specific date range.

Tips: enter Boolean operators, proximity operators, or truncation symbols directly into the search box.

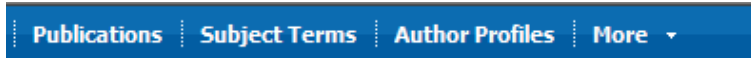
Note: These words in the *SO Publication Name* field would be especially useful for finding articles with either *History*, *Historian*, *Historical*, or *Latin America* or *Latin American* in the **journal name**.

Special search links:



- Use **Publications** to search for articles from a specific journal or to find whether a publication is indexed in the database, its peer-review status, dates of coverage, full text availability, etc.
- Use **Subject Terms** to identify and select official subject terms, which may improve your search results. You also can identify subject terms from the suggestions that appear to the left of a search results list or by viewing a full citation record
- Use **Author Profiles** to find an author's academic credentials, contact information, etc.
- When you have a good article on your topic, search **Cited References** (under **More**) to find other articles that have cited it.
- Use **Images** (under **More**) to retrieve articles with pictures of people, places, and things (see also image limiters on search form).
- Use **Indexes** (under **More**) to browse entries for and search specific fields (*author, geographic terms, language, subject terms, etc.*).

- Hover mouse on magnifying glass to get quick view of the article abstract, or click the title link to open the full citation view.
- Full text is provided for this article.
- Click the white arrow to show or hide any limiter category.
- Click the *Article Linker* button or **Check for possible Full Text** to see if full text is available from another source. See also link for **Article & Book Requests** on the library homepage for document delivery options.



From the full citation view, click a desired icon to print, email, save, view citation styles (APA, MLA, Chicago, etc.), export a record, or add it to a folder, and then follow onscreen instructions. *Caution:* While the sample citations provided are extremely convenient, always check them for possible formatting errors or incorrect data, and verify with official style manuals.
