Bachelor of Applied Science (B.A.S.) at the University of Houston-Clear Lake
2009-2010 2+2 Transfer Plan to University of Houston-Clear Lake

This 120 hour degree program is designed to accommodate many of the Child Development/Early Childhood courses and the General Core Curriculum courses required for the Associate of Applied Science (A.A. S.) in Child Development. A maximum of 60 hours may be transferred from lower level with the remaining 60 hours taken at upper level. The 42 hour General Core Curriculum requirements may be taken as a combination of upper level and lower level courses. Students also take a total of 78 hours of a combination of upper and lower level Child Development/Early Childhood and related coursework. A minimum of 18 hours of Child Development/Early Childhood courses must be taken at the lower level. Other lower level courses may also be acceptable. 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EXPLANATION OF FOOTNOTES

- * UHCL's requirements are consistent with the 42-hour Texas core curriculum. If a student completes a component of the core at one Texas institution, that block of courses will be substituted for UHCL's same core component(s). Additional Program Foundation courses are required. **Please refer to your school's core requirements for specific courses in each area below.**
- ** These courses may be fulfilled by approved upper-level equivalents at UHCL.
- *** Admission to this degree program requires an A.A.S in Child Development or a similar field. Applicants who do not hold an appropriate A.A.S will be accepted provided they meet the university admissions standards and have completed 18 hours of course work in child development, early childhood education or a related field. The courses listed here are the suggested courses for each track. Other courses can be accepted.
- a Must complete six hours of Composition with grades of "C-" or better. Students following the Early Childhood Program Leadership Track should complete ENGL 2311 in place of ENGL 1302.
- b Suggested courses for Humanities include: any ENGL literature, HUMA, PHIL, RELI, SPCH or HIST (in addition to core requirements), or sophomore-level foreign language course.
- c Six hours of American History required; three hours may be in Texas History.
- d Suggested courses for Visual and Performing Arts include: any ARTS, DANC, DRAM, MUSI, or MUAP course. Three semester hours credit required.
- e Suggested courses for Natural Science include: any ASTR, BIOL, CHEM, ESCI, GEOL, or PHYS courses. One course in Life Science (BIOL) and one course in Earth Science (GEOL) or Physical Science (PHYS/CHEM) preferred.
- f Suggested courses for Social and Behavioral Science include: any ANTH, ECON, GEOG, PSYC, or SOCI course. Also any GOVT or HIST course in addition to core requirements.
- g Suggested courses for Speech/Communication include: any SPCH course.
- h Suggested courses for Computer Competency include: any COSC or CSCI course. Other courses may meet this requirement. Please check with an adviser on your campus.

GENERAL DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

- A total of 120 semester hours of applicable college credit. A maximum of three hours of lower-level "activities" courses may be applied toward graduation. No more than 18 semester hours of previously earned lower-level credit may have been taken by correspondence, extension or CLEP.
- At least 60 semester hours of upper-level work. Some lower-level coursework may be approved to replace upper-level hours. See an academic advisor for details.
- At least 30 hours of the degree program must be taken in residence at UHCL.
- A cumulative GPA of 2.000 on course work completed at UHCL with grades of "C" or better on at least 30 hours of resident upper-level work. Grades of "C-" and below cannot be applied toward the 30 hours of resident upper-level work.
- Remain continuously enrolled (complete at least one course in a 12 month period) or meet requirements of a later catalog.
- Complete the degree within seven years or meet requirements of a later catalog.
